Any incident reports, after-action documentation, or case files generated in connection with this visit.

Three law enforcement officers arrived at a locked federal gate on restricted federal land where I reside as a U.S. Forest Service volunteer caretaker. None of the officers identified themselves properly. However, one of the officers is now known as U.S. Forest Service Special Agent Matthew Oliver. The other two remain unknown and the Forest Service will not identify them. They stated they were concerned about content I had posted online about my dismissal from Oregon State Parks volunteer service. I declined to speak without an attorney and closed the door. Approximately twenty minutes later Special Agent Oliver called me by phone and stated the matter was not going away and that the state police wanted to speak to me. I recorded the officers departing. Oregon plate 731 QRV is visible on camera.

Thank you for your response dated April 3, 2026. I am writing to follow up on the search conducted in response to my request.

My request concerned a specific law enforcement visit that occurred on March 24, 2026 at 82900 Highway 101, Florence, Oregon 97439 a locked U.S. Forest Service facility on restricted federal land. The visit involved at least two officers and Oregon plate 731 QRV was recorded on camera at the scene.

Before I determine whether to pursue further remedies available under Oregon public records law, I am asking that you provide the following information in writing:

1. What records systems were searched in response to this request?
2. Were dispatch logs for March 24, 2026 searched?
3. Were vehicle activity records or motor pool logs for plate 731 QRV searched?
4. Were officer duty logs or activity reports for March 24, 2026 searched?
5. Were any records located and withheld rather than produced? If so, please identify the specific statutory exemption claimed for each withheld record.

I want to be direct: I have video documentation of this visit. A U.S. Forest Service Special Agent present at the same visit has been confirmed by name by Forest Service supervisory staff. Multiple Forest Service employees name in writing that state police were present at this incident. A same-day determination that no responsive records exist is not consistent with a thorough search of the records I have described.

I am preserving all rights and remedies available to me under Oregon public records law, including the right to seek review through the District Attorney's office under ORS 192.401 if this matter is not resolved to my satisfaction.

Dear Public Records Officer:

I am writing to request a waiver of the \$12.50 fee associated with producing the Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) record you have identified as responsive to my public records request.

I request this fee waiver on the following grounds:

1. Public Interest in Disclosure

This record documents law enforcement contact that occurred on restricted federal land behind a locked gate where I live and work as a volunteer caretaker for the U.S. Forest Service. On March 24, 2026 exactly one year after my dismissal from the Oregon State

Parks volunteer program three armed officers appeared at my residence: one U.S. Forest Service special agent and two Oregon State Police officers.

I was not provided the names or badge numbers of the state police officers at the time of contact. When I asked the USFS special agent's supervisor (Captain Brandon Boyd) to identify the two state officers, he instructed me to file this FOIA request to obtain that information.

The public has a significant interest in understanding:

- Under what authority state police officers accessed restricted federal land
- What coordination occurred between state and federal agencies
- Whether this contact was connected to my prior documentation of institutional conduct at Oregon State Parks
- Whether proper protocols were followed for multi-agency law enforcement contact with a civilian on federal property

2. I Am Not Seeking Commercial Gain

I am seeking this information solely to understand the circumstances of law enforcement contact at my residence and to exercise my right to know the identities of officers who appeared at my door. I have no commercial interest in this record.

3. Ability to Pay

I am a volunteer caretaker living in an RV with no regular income. The \$12.50 fee, while modest, represents a meaningful expense given my current financial constraints. More importantly, charging a fee to learn the identity of officers who visited my home creates a barrier to a fundamental right.

4. I Have Every Right to Know Who Visited Me

When law enforcement officers appear at a person's residence particularly on restricted federal land where public access is prohibited that person has a basic right to know who those officers are. Requiring payment to obtain this information creates an unjust barrier to accountability.

The CAD record you have identified contains information I should have been provided at the time of contact. I should not be required to pay for information that should have been disclosed voluntarily.

Conclusion

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If you deny this fee waiver request, please provide a written explanation of the denial and inform me of any appeal rights.

Dear Ms. Carlson,

I am writing regarding the outstanding CAD record in SP26097765 / PR27478.

Let me set out where this stands.

On April 3, the Department told me no responsive records existed. On April 4, I asked how that search had been conducted. On April 13, a responsive CAD record appeared, with a \$12.50 fee attached, payable by check or money order only. That same day I requested a waiver and told you I am a volunteer caretaker living in an RV on restricted federal land with no regular income.

On April 14, the Department responded to that statement of indigence by sending me a scanned PDF to print, complete by hand, sign, and mail.

I want to name what has been built here. To learn the identities of two armed officers who came to my home, I must first ask. Then ask again about the search. Then wait. Then be told a record exists after being told it did not. Then be assessed a fee. Then be told the fee may be paid only by an instrument requiring a bank and a postal service. Then, to be relieved of that fee on grounds of poverty, I must produce a printer, paper, ink, an envelope, a stamp, and a mailbox.

Every step is defensible on its own. Together they are a wall, and the wall is the answer.

I am not going to pretend this is administrative. A person with no income was told that access to a record about himself requires equipment he does not have, to escape a fee he cannot pay, for information he should never have had to request.

So let me state the thing plainly.

I should not have to pay to obtain a single record documenting an action taken against me. On March 24, 2026, three armed officers arrived at my residence on restricted federal land, one year to the day after my dismissal from the Oregon State Parks volunteer program. Two of them were Oregon State Police. They did not give me their names. They did not give me their badge numbers. Captain Felicia Sloan of the U.S. Forest Service told me to file this request if I wanted to know who they were. My U.S. Forest Service Ranger has documented, in writing, that she sought that information herself and could not obtain it.

I have a right to know who was at my home. Period. Not as a courtesy. Not upon payment. Not after completing

a form designed for people with offices.

That right does not begin when a check clears.

I ask that the Department accept my April 13 correspondence as the waiver request, grant it, and produce the record. If a signature is required, I will provide one electronically. If the Department will not do this, I ask for a written statement of the specific authority requiring a printed and mailed form, and the rule that forecloses electronic submission.

I am asking the Oregon State Police to tell me who came to my home. The record exists. The Department has said so.

Ms. Hubbard,

Thank you again for the production under PR27478. I have reviewed the CAD record for event SP26097765 and I have questions the record itself raises. I am requesting that these be answered by the supervisor of the responding unit, or by whichever OSP official

is in a position to speak to the origin and conduct of the event, rather than by the records section these are questions about the event, not about the records process, and I do not want to put you in the position of answering for conduct that isn't yours.

My questions are as follows.

1. Source of my date of birth.

The record lists my date of birth, 04/11/1977. I did not provide it to Oregon State Police. The event is logged as "Officer Initiated," with "No Call Type Selected," and closed with a disposition of "No Action Taken."

What was the source of my date of birth? Was it provided to the responding unit by another agency or individual, and if so, by whom? Alternatively, was a records or database check performed on me? If a check was performed, under what authorized purpose was

it conducted, given that the event carries no call type, no crime, and a disposition of no action taken?

2. Source of the location.

The dispatch address is listed solely as "SILTCOOS WORK CENTER." The record contains no street address, no cross street, no county, no beat, no region, and no coordinates. Every geographic field except the facility name is blank.

Siltcoos Work Center is an internal United States Forest Service facility designation. My residence has no street address. How did the responding unit obtain that location, and from whom? A facility name of that kind is not publicly indexed, and I would like

to understand how it came to be the sole locator on an officer-initiated event.

3. My name in the "Caller" field.

The record lists "Caller: WHITE, ROBERT," while simultaneously listing the source of the event as "Officer Initiated." I did not call Oregon State Police. I did not request contact. I was separately listed in the record as "Person: WHITE, ROBERT Role: Other."

What does the "Caller" field denote in an officer-initiated event, and why does my name appear in it? If this is a system convention rather than a factual entry, I would like that stated, so that the record is not read by any future party as indicating that I summoned police to my own residence.

4. The stated purpose.

The event comment reads: "FOR THE FOREST SERVICE // FOLLOWUP INTERVIEW W/ ROBERT WHITE."

I am the U.S. Forest Service volunteer caretaker at that location. The Forest Service has my phone number, my email address, and direct access to me, and has had throughout. I am asking OSP to state what request or communication from the Forest Service that comment refers to, who at the Forest Service made it, and in what form it was received.

I would also ask what "followup" refers to. I had no prior interview with Oregon State Police.

5. Origin and travel.

The record shows dispatch at 08:41:32 and arrival at 09:50:02, with the event closed at 10:18:42. That is approximately sixty-nine minutes of travel each direction for an event logged as low priority with no action taken. What was the origin point of the responding unit, and can OSP provide the total travel time associated with this event?

6. Other personnel.

The record names one unit: Hyde, Jake (56397), unit 9452. Three officers were present at my residence, one of whom has been identified as U.S. Forest Service Special Agent Matthew Oliver. Can OSP identify any other Oregon State Police personnel present at or associated with this event, and identify which officer was associated with the vehicle bearing Oregon license plate 731 QRV, which is visible in my recording of the officers departing?

To be clear about why I am asking. The record establishes that a criminal-designated unit was dispatched to a private citizen at a location with no street address, on an event with no call type, no crime, and no action taken, with that citizen's date of birth already in hand. Information of that kind my identity and my location was not available to a responding trooper independently. Someone provided it. The record does not say who, and "Officer Initiated" does not account for it.

I am not asking OSP to characterize anything. I am asking OSP to explain the origin of specific information contained in its own record.

I understand some of this may need to be processed as a new records request rather than as correspondence, and I am content for it to be handled either way. If any portion is withheld, I ask that the specific statutory

exemption be cited for each withheld item.

I would appreciate a response from the responding unit's supervisor or the appropriate OSP official.

I am writing regarding PR27478 and the records that request encompassed.

My request of April 3, 2026 sought all records related to the March 24, 2026 visit to my residence, including dispatch logs and all communications related to the planning, authorization, or coordination of that visit. The CAD record you released on July 14 is responsive to that request. It is not the whole of what is responsive to it.

The CAD identifies DPSST #48454, Tawny Woodward, an Oregon State Police dispatcher, as having created event SP26097765 at 08:41:32 and as the author of the event comment, "FOR THE FOREST SERVICE // FOLLOWUP INTERVIEW W/ ROBERT WHITE."

A dispatcher does not originate an event. She records one. That entry, my date of birth, and the location "Siltcoos Work Center" were communicated to her by someone. That communication is a record, and it is responsive to my request.

I am therefore requesting the following, and I note that these should have been produced as part of PR27478:

1. All audio recordings of radio and telephone communications between Oregon State Police dispatch and any person, on March 24, 2026, relating to event SP26097765 or to me by name, including but not limited to any communication in which the event was requested, initiated, or described.
2. Any recorded line, non-emergency line, or administrative line communication in which my name, my date of birth, or the location "Siltcoos Work Center" was conveyed to dispatch.
3. All CAD audit trail data for event SP26097765, including entry, modification, and access logs.
4. Any written communication -- email, message, or note -- received by dispatch or by the responding unit relating to this event.

If any of these records exist and were not produced under PR27478, I ask that you state why they were not, given that the request expressly sought dispatch logs and communications relating to the planning, authorization, or coordination of the visit.

I am writing regarding PR27478.

The record shows the following.

I submitted this request on April 3, 2026. On the same day, April 3, 2026, Marni L. Carlson wrote to me stating: "The Department has conducted a search which identified no records responsive to your request."

On April 13, 2026, a CAD record for the March 24 event was printed inside the Central Records Section. On July 14, 2026, you released that record to me in full, having reviewed it for exempt material with none identified.

The request that Ms. Carlson closed on April 3 asked for the following:

All records related to the March 24, 2026 visit to 82900 Highway 101, Florence, Oregon 97439, including:

- The names, badge numbers, and unit assignments of all Oregon State Police officers present.
- All communications related to the planning, authorization, or coordination of this visit.
- All communications referencing my name, my online activity, or the domain oprdvolunteerabuse.org.
- Any incident reports, case files, or after-action documentation.
- All communications between any OSP officer and U.S. Forest Service Special Agent Matthew Oliver or any Oregon Parks and Recreation Department employee in connection with this visit.

The request also stated, in two places, that I had issued a litigation preservation notice to Oregon State Police dated April 2, 2026, and requested acknowledgment of that notice. I have never received acknowledgment.

To date, one record has been produced: the CAD for event SP26097765.

The following categories were requested on April 3, 2026 and have not been produced, nor has any exemption been cited for withholding them:

1. The names, badge numbers, and unit assignments of all Oregon State Police officers present. The CAD names one unit. Two Oregon State Police officers were at my door. The vehicle bearing Oregon plate 731 QRV

is visible in my recording of them departing.

2. All communications relating to the planning, authorization, or coordination of the visit. The CAD identifies DPSST #48454, Tawny Woodward, an OSP dispatcher, as the creator of the event and the author of its comment. A dispatcher records what she is told.

The communication in which that information -- my name, my date of birth, the location "Siltcoos Work Center," and the stated purpose -- was conveyed to dispatch is responsive to this request. So is any recorded radio or telephone traffic on March 24, 2026 relating to this event.

3. All communications referencing my name, my online activity, or oprdvolunteerabuse.org.

4. Any incident reports, case files, or after-action documentation.

5. All communications between any OSP officer and Special Agent Matthew Oliver or any OPRD employee in connection with this visit.

6. CAD audit trail data for event SP26097765, including entry, modification, and access logs.

I would ask the following.

What search was conducted on April 3, 2026? Which systems were queried, by whom, and against what terms? A search that identified no records on April 3 did not locate a CAD record that existed at the time and was printed ten days later.

For each of the categories above, does Oregon State Police maintain records responsive to it? If a category is empty, please state that. If records exist and are being withheld, please cite the specific statutory exemption claimed for each.

Finally, I am restating the preservation notice served April 2, 2026 and referenced in the request Ms. Carlson answered. All recorded dispatch communications for March 24, 2026, all CAD audit data for event SP26097765, and all communications identified above are subject to it and must be preserved.

I renew my request for a fee waiver on public interest grounds. I am not seeking these records for commercial purposes.

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The following categories were requested on April 3, 2026 and have not been produced, nor has any exemption been cited for withholding them:

1. The names, badge numbers, and unit assignments of all Oregon State Police officers present. The CAD names one unit. Two Oregon State Police officers were at my door. The vehicle bearing Oregon plate 731 QRV is visible in my recording of them departing.

2. All communications relating to the planning, authorization, or coordination of the visit. The CAD identifies DPSST #48454, Tawny Woodward, an OSP dispatcher, as the creator of the event and the author of its comment. A dispatcher records what she is told.

The communication in which that information -- my name, my date of birth, the location "Siltcoos Work Center," and the stated purpose -- was conveyed to dispatch is responsive to this request. So is any recorded radio or telephone traffic on March 24, 2026 relating to this event.

3. All communications referencing my name, my online activity, or oprdvolunteerabuse.org.

4. Any incident reports, case files, or after-action documentation.

5. All communications between any OSP officer and Special Agent Matthew Oliver or any OPRD employee in connection with this visit.

6. CAD audit trail data for event SP26097765, including entry, modification, and access logs.

I would ask the following.

What search was conducted on April 3, 2026? Which systems were queried, by whom, and against what terms? A search that identified no records on April 3 did not locate a CAD record that existed at the time and was printed ten days later.

For each of the categories above, does Oregon State Police maintain records responsive to it? If a category is empty, please state that. If records exist and are being withheld, please cite the specific statutory exemption claimed for each.

Finally, I am restating the preservation notice served April 2, 2026 and referenced in the request Ms. Carlson answered. All recorded dispatch communications for March 24, 2026, all CAD audit data for event SP26097765, and all communications identified above are subject to it and must be preserved.

I renew my request for a fee waiver on public interest grounds. I am not seeking these records for commercial purposes.

Ms. Hubbard,

I am writing again regarding PR27478, on one subject: whether the records subject to my preservation notice still exist.

I served a litigation preservation notice on Oregon State Police on April 2, 2026. I referenced it in two places in the request I submitted on April 3 and asked for acknowledgment. I restated it on July 15. I have never received acknowledgment that it was received, or any indication that it was distributed to the custodians of the records it covers.

That notice is now three and a half months old. The recorded dispatch communications it covers are subject to a retention schedule. I am asking, plainly, whether they are still there.

Specifically, I ask Oregon State Police to state the following in writing.

1. Was the preservation notice of April 2, 2026 received? On what date, and by whom? Was it distributed to the custodians of the covered records, and if so, to which units?
2. Do the recorded dispatch communications for March 24, 2026 relating to event SP26097765 still exist, in whole or in part? This includes radio traffic and any telephone traffic to or from dispatch relating to that event.
3. What retention schedule applies to those recordings, and what is the scheduled destruction date? If that date has passed, state whether the records were destroyed and on what date.
4. Does the CAD audit trail data for event SP26097765 -- entry, modification, and access logs -- still exist?
5. Since April 2, 2026, has any record responsive to my April 3 request been destroyed, purged, overwritten, or allowed to age off a retention schedule? If so, identify what and when.

If the answer to any of these is that the record no longer exists, I am asking to be told that. A statement that a record is gone is a complete and adequate answer to this letter. What I cannot work with is not knowing.

I want to be clear about how I understand the record so far. On April 3, 2026, Marni Carlson wrote that a search identified no responsive records. On April 13, 2026, a CAD record for the event was printed inside the Central Records Section. On July 14, 2026, you released that record to me in full, having found no exempt material in it. I do not attribute any of that to you. You produced the only record that has been produced, and you did it promptly and completely. My concern is not with your conduct.

My concern is that a search which found nothing on April 3 did not find a record that existed on April 3, and that the notice which should have frozen everything around that record has never been acknowledged. Those two facts sit next to each other, and together they raise a question about whether anything covered by the notice was preserved at all.

The five categories I requested on April 3 remain unproduced, and no exemption has been cited for any of it. My questions of July 14 regarding the origin of the event are outstanding, and I understand those may need to be routed to someone other than you.

I renew my request for a fee waiver on public interest grounds. I am not seeking these records for any commercial purpose.

I would ask for an acknowledgement and response on the preservation questions above.

Ms. Hubbard,

A correction, in my own name, before anything further goes out.

I have cited ORS 192.415 in my correspondence with your office. That is the wrong statute. Oregon State Police is a state agency, and review of a state agency's denial goes to the Attorney General under ORS 192.411. ORS 192.415 is the district attorney route, for public bodies that are not state agencies. The forum I named was right. The citation was mine to get right, and I did not.

I am correcting it here rather than letting it stand, because I would rather be the one who finds my errors than have someone else find them for me.

I want to say plainly where I understand this to be going. My requests remain unanswered in substantial part, and I expect this matter to move to the Attorney General, and if necessary beyond. I am conscious of what that means. Anything I put in a filing is a representation I have to be able to support, in full, on the record, without qualification. People lose these matters not because the facts were against them but because they overstated one thing and handed the other side something true to point at. I am not going to do that.

So I will keep saying only what the record says, and I will keep correcting myself in writing when I am wrong, including when it costs me nothing to stay quiet.

The categories requested April 3 remain outstanding, as does the question of what search was conducted, the identity of DPSST #48454, the questions of July 14, the status of the recorded dispatch communications, and acknowledgment of the preservation notice served April 2. My fee waiver request stands.

Ms. Hubbard,

This is my final correspondence to Oregon State Police before I file with the Attorney General.

I am adding one category to what remains outstanding under PR27478, and then I am setting a date.

The recorded communications for March 24, 2026.

The CAD you released establishes that event SP26097765 occurred in your dispatch system. The event shows a unit dispatched at 08:41:32, arriving at 09:50:02, and cleared at 10:18:42, after roughly sixty-nine minutes of travel each direction. Three vehicles and multiple officers were involved; two Oregon State Police officers were at my door, and I have the plate of one departing vehicle, 731 QRV, which does not correspond to the single unit named in the CAD.

Communications of the kind this event necessarily generated should reasonably exist: the dispatch audio in which the event was created and the unit assigned; radio traffic among the responding units on March 24; and any mobile data terminal messaging between them. An operation involving three coordinating vehicles over that distance does not occur in silence. Those recordings are responsive to my April 3 request for all communications relating to the planning, authorization, or coordination of the visit, and I am restating that request specifically as to them now.

I served a preservation notice on Oregon State Police on April 2, 2026, contained in the body of my original request. Recorded dispatch communications are subject to a retention schedule. Those recordings are now approaching four months old. I am asking you to state, in writing, whether they still exist, in whole or in part, and if any responsive recording has been destroyed, purged, or allowed to age off a retention schedule since April 2, 2026, to identify what and when.

The date.

If Oregon State Police has not substantively responded by Wednesday, I will file a petition for review with the Oregon Attorney General under ORS 192.411 on that day.

What the petition will state.

For your reference, the petition will set out the following, drawn entirely from your own records and the documented sequence of events:

On April 3, 2026, the Department certified in writing that a search identified no records responsive to my request. On April 13, ten days later, a responsive CAD record for the event was printed inside the Central Records Section. On July 14, that record was released to me in full, reviewed by the Department's own legal compliance specialist for exempt material, with none identified. The Department's initial no-records finding is therefore contradicted by its own subsequent production, and the Department has never described the search that produced the April 3 result or answered the five specific questions I posed about it that same day.

The petition will state that the Department has not provided a complete response under ORS 192.329(2). Of the categories requested on April 3, one record has been produced. For the remainder the identities and unit assignments of all officers present, the communications relating to the coordination of the visit, the recorded dispatch and radio communications, any incident or after-action documentation, communications referencing me or oprdvolunteerabuse.org, and communications with U.S. Forest Service Special Agent Matthew Oliver the Department has produced nothing, cited no exemption, and never stated that any category is empty. A request does not become complete by remaining open for over a hundred days.

The petition will state that the Department never ruled on the fee waiver I requested on April 3 and again on April 13. It conditioned production on a \$12.50 fee and a printed, mailed form, and then, on July 14, released the record with no fee at all establishing that no fee was ever required. A waiver request answered with a paper barrier and never granted or denied is an unreasonable denial under ORS 192.324(6).

The petition will state that the Department has never acknowledged the preservation notice served April 2, despite three requests, and has never stated whether the recorded communications identified above still exist.

And the petition will ask the Attorney General to order the Department to state, for each category, whether responsive records exist; to produce all non-exempt records; to cite the specific exemption for anything withheld; to state whether the March 24 recordings still exist and, if not, when they were destroyed; and to impose the penalty available under ORS 192.407 if the Department is found to have responded with undue delay or failed to respond.

I would still prefer to resolve this at your level, and I remain willing to. But I have been asking since April, and the record now includes a certified no-records finding that the Department's own production disproves. I am not able to leave that unresolved.

If a substantive response is not received by Wednesday, I will file.

I renew my request for a fee waiver on public interest grounds. I am not seeking these records for any commercial purpose.

THE GATE IS MARKED WITH RESTRICTED ACCESS SIGNAGE CITING 36 CFR 261.9(E). THE OFFICERS DID NOT FORMALLY IDENTIFY THEIR AGENCY. THEY STATED THEY WERE CONCERNED ABOUT WHAT I WAS POSTING ONLINE ABOUT OREGON STATE PARKS. THEY REPEATEDLY SAID I WAS NOT IN TROUBLE WHEN I SAID I WOULD NOT SPEAK TO THEM WITHOUT AN ATTORNEY. THEY KEPT PRESSING AND I EVENTUALLY SHUT THE DOOR. I RECORDED THEIR VEHICLES AS THEY DEPARTED. ONE LICENSE PLATE IS CLEARLY VISIBLE IN THAT RECORDING, WHICH IS PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE. APPROXIMATELY 20 MINUTES LATER, AN OFFICER IDENTIFYING HIMSELF AS FOREST SERVICE CALLED ME BY PHONE. HE WAS HOSTILE IN TONE AND TOLD ME THIS WAS NOT GOING ANY AND THAT THE OTHER OFFICERS WANTED TO TALK TO ME. I TOLD HIM THIS WAS INTIMIDATION AND RETALIATION ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF MY DISMISSAL FROM OREGON STATE PARKS. HE CONTINUED TO PUSH WHILE I ASSERTED MY FIRST AMENDMENT RIGHT AND REFUSED TO SPEAK WITHOUT AN ATTORNEY. I HUNG UP. ON MARCH 27, 2026 I CALLED THE NUMBER HE HAD USED, 541-613-4606, TO REQUEST THE NAMES AND CONTACT INFORMATION OF ALL THREE OFFICERS. HE REFUSED. Captain Sloan,

Thank you for the prompt response and for confirming Agent Oliver's employment and role.

I want to be direct about what your response clarifies and what it does not.

You have confirmed that a Special Agent from the investigative branch visited my federal work center on March 24, 2026. That is a significant clarification. Investigators do not conduct welfare checks. If this was an investigative action, there is a record of it — who authorized it, what its purpose was, and why it occurred on the one-year anniversary of my dismissal from Oregon State Parks.

Agent Oliver refused to identify the two state law enforcement officers who accompanied him. In a legitimate investigation, identifying participating officers is routine. His refusal to do so — and his subsequent hang-up — raises questions your response does not address.

I am asking directly: who authorized Agent Oliver's visit to my work center on March 24, 2026, and what was the stated purpose of that visit?

I am also requesting the names and contact information of the two state officers who accompanied him.

I will note that this correspondence, along with the official Siuslaw Host/Caretaker Incident Report filed on March 27, 2026, is part of a documented public record.
