Park Host Annual Pass

Your Park Host Special Access Pass is an electronic PDF that may also be printed. When printed, it is intended to be folded, and left on the dash of your vehicle in day use parking fee areas.

The Park Host Special Access Pass waives the following fees:

1. Camping and reservation fees for a maximum of one night when traveling to or from an OPRD host assignment and home.
2. A maximum of two nights (no more than one night at the same park) when traveling between OPRD host assignments.
3. Day-Use parking fees at Oregon State Parks.

How to use the Park Host Special Access Pass for camping:

1. Place a reservation request at minimum of 14 days in advance using this online form: <https://www.jotform.com/222274489334057>

If you don't make a reservation in advance using the form above, you must pay the day-use or overnight fee and request a refund from OPRD. To request a refund, call the park info line at 800-551-6949 and give them your Host ID Number, or send a copy of your receipt to OPRD, Attn: Host Program, 725 Summer St NE, Suite C, Salem, OR 97301.

How to display the Park Host Special Access Pass while camping:

1. Place the printed pass on the dash of your vehicle or show the electronic pass to a park ranger when requested.
2. A photo ID may be requested as proof of identity during your stay.

How to use the Park Host Special Access Pass for day-use parking:

1. When you arrive at the park, place a printed version of the Park Host Special Access Pass onto your vehicle's dash.
2. If you are on a motorcycle or other open-air vehicle, don't place your pass on your vehicle. Instead, keep it with you (park staff may ask you to present it at any time).
3. A photo ID may be requested as proof of identity during your stay.

Especially important:

1. Only the named individuals on the Park Host Special Access Pass are authorized to use it. It is not transferable to anyone else, even other volunteers.
2. If you are a part of a host team, this pass may only be used to reserve the approved overnight stays for your team. It may not be used by the individual members of a host team to reserve more nights than would be available to a solo host. For example: When traveling to a park host assignment, the separate members of a host team may not reserve more than one fee waived night for the team.
3. Reservations can only be made for park hosts with confirmed assignments. If your volunteer assignment has not been confirmed, staff will not be able to make your reservation. If your special access pass reservation is denied for these reasons, contact the park where you are scheduled to confirm your assignment and have it officially documented on your volunteer profile.
4. Upon arrival at the park, a photo ID will be required to document you as the owner of the Park Host Special Access Pass.
5. If you lose the Park Host Special Access Pass, notify the host coordinator at your assigned park.
6. This pass will expire on December 31st of the year indicated on the Park Host Special Access Pass.
7. This fee waiver is for Oregon State Parks only. County, federal and state campgrounds operated by other agencies will still charge you a fee.
